Report on Tanglewood Court Usage

4th Quarter 2014

Tennis court activity continued to be strong through October but understandably declined sharply in November and even further in December due to weather restrictions.

The clay courts have been unplayable since the middle of November and will likely continue to be unplayable until March. There was hope that we could keep 3 clay courts open throughout the winter, but the cold and dampness doesn't allow for the courts to be properly prepared for play. It is a combination of cold but also wetness that prevents adequate court maintenance to keep the courts in shape for play. The court surface must dry out to a point where the court can be rolled properly, but they never seem to dry adequately for that to be done.

The hard courts are perfectly playable, but again the cold temperatures have kept people away from playing although we have attempted to bring in players by offering some programs, but we have had almost no takers.

We did not have any tennis tournaments in this quarter.
