

How to Register and Vote During One-Stop Absentee

If a North Carolina resident has missed the 25 day deadline for voter registration and has lived at their current address for at least thirty (30) days, he/she may register and vote during One-Stop Absentee Voting.

To vote during One-Stop Absentee Voting, a resident must fill out a voter registration application and prove residency by providing appropriate identification with current name and current address. The new registrant may vote ONLY at a One-Stop Absentee Voting Site in the county of registration during One-Stop Absentee Voting and not on Election Day.

Acceptable forms of identification include:

- North Carolina driver's license with current address
- Utility bill with name and current address
- Telephone or mobile phone bill
- Electric or gas bill
- Cable television bill
- Water or sewage bill
- Document with name and current address from a local, state, or U.S. government agency such as a:
 - Passport
 - Government-issued photo ID
 - U.S. military ID
 - License to hunt, fish, own a gun, etc.
 - Property tax bill
 - Automotive registration
 - Certified documentation of naturalization
 - Public housing or Social Service Agency document
 - Check, invoice, or letter from a government agency
 - Birth certificate
- Student photo ID along with a document from the school showing the student's name and current address.
- Paycheck or paycheck stub from an employer or a W-2 statement
- Bank statement or bank-issued credit card statement

Proof of residence does not include any piece of mail addressed to the voter. If you cannot supply acceptable Proof-of-Residence, your registration form cannot be processed until the required information is provided.
