# NC Income Tax Forms

As a cost saving measure, the North Carolina Department of Revenue is no longer providing North Carolina income tax forms and instruction booklets to public libraries, post offices or other public facilities.

We apologize for any inconvenience this may cause. Please know that the library staff is not trained to give tax advice, and *CANNOT* identify, choose or locate the forms that are right for you.

## Here are some options for locating and completing your North Carolina income tax forms:

**Order your tax forms by telephone.** Call the NC Department of Revenue at 1-877-252-3052 and have your forms and instructions delivered by mail to your home address.

**Go online and request forms be mailed to you at your home address.** Go to the NC Dept of Revenue's website at <http://www.dornrc.com/request>, fill out the form requesting that your tax forms and instructions be mailed to you at your home address.

**Find forms online and print them.** Find the forms you need and print copies of them. You can then fill out by hand and mail in to the NC Department of Revenue. Visit <http://www.dornrc.com> to find your forms.

**Fill in your form online, and then print them.** Find your form(s) online at the Department of Revenue's website at [www.dornrc.com](http://www.dornrc.com). Look for the links to "personalized form" or "web fill in" forms, fill it out on your computer, and then print a copy of the completed form to be mailed.

**Complete and submit your tax returns online, using E-File.** The NC Department of Revenue has information on how to use E-File products at <http://www.dornrc.com/electronic/e-file.html>.

**Have the local NC Department of Revenue Service Center help you file your State taxes** The center is located at 8025 North Point Blvd, Suite 250 in Winston-Salem, and is open M-F 8:00am-4:30pm. For this service you must call for an appointment at 896-7024.

**Have VITA or AARP help you complete and submit your taxes.** Several tax preparation sites are available throughout Forsyth County at Library branches and elsewhere in the community. See the reverse side of this flyer for locations throughout the county where you can receive VITA or AARP tax assistance.

**If you need computer time to work on your taxes you may use public computers at any of the branches of Forsyth County Public Library.** For longer times, the downtown Central Library, located at 660 W. 5th Street in Winston-Salem, offers research computers on the second floor. You may make a reservation for a research computer up to one day in advance. Research computers are available all hours that the Central Library is open. You may also drop in the Central Library's Computer Learning Center located on the first floor between 9:00 am to 11:00 am Mondays and Wednesdays. Tax filers who are comfortable accessing the Internet independently can use either option in two hour blocks of time to find and print forms, fill forms out online, or E-file their taxes. Library staff and volunteers are *NOT* able to provide any tax assistance and advice regarding tax forms or tax returns.



**Important Note to Tax Filers!**  
**The NC Department of Revenue WILL NOT accept tax forms that have been photocopied, scanned, or faxed.**
